Therapist Job Description

Full-Time, Flexible Hours

- Maintain an active caseload of 25-30 client-hours each week.
- Document according to the policies and procedures of Room To Talk.
- Track services for billing reports.
- Engage in crisis management, suicide prevention, safety planning, and resource navigation with clients on the phone and in person.
- Complete intake interviews as needed.
- Attend monthly 1.5 hour Room to Talk Group Supervision sessions.

Required qualifications:

- Master's degree in Social Work or Counseling
- LMSW or LPC in the state of Michigan
- 3-5 years' experience providing therapy to adults
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- A commitment to working with diverse identities, including intersecting identities of race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, and gender identity
- Ability to form effective partnerships with clients, staff, volunteers, and donors
- A strong commitment to collaboration and cross-training – i.e., learning other roles in the organization and pitching in where necessary
- Creativity and a desire to grow

Desired qualifications:

- Ability to fluently speak a language other than English
